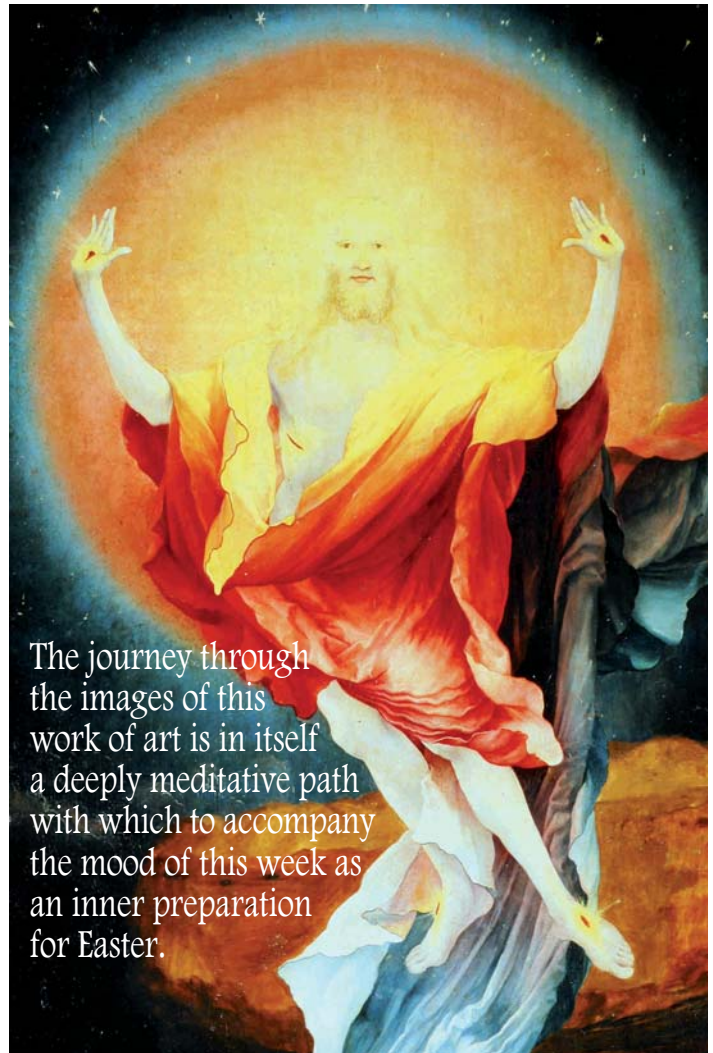

Painted at the turn of the 16th century, when hospitals were more like hospices for the poor, the Isenheim Altar was mounted in the chapel of a monastery as a thing of beauty in itself and a source of active therapy, hope and consolation for dying patients.
